Course Objectives	Students in this class will perform a variety of listening practices to acquire the Japanese listening ability required for activities in university life, including listening to a lecture and participating in a seminar or study group, and for daily life.
Course Goals	• Acquire and develop the listening ability required for listening to a lecture or participating in a seminar or study group at Japanese university. • Acquire and develop the listening ability required for daily life.
Class schedule	This class will focus on a variety of listening activities required for university life, and these will cover single person's speeches, such as a lecture, and conversations with friends and discussions during a seminar. Television and radio are main tool to proceed with classes. < Main contents > • Listening to news • Listening to conversations • Listening to lectures • Listening to discussions • Watching and listening to dramas/ TV programs
