Course Objectives	Students in this class will understand the meanings of the kanji and vocabulary words required for study and research life at university and for daily life, and will acquire ability to correctly read and use them.
Course Goals	Understand the readings and meanings of the kanji characters and vocabulary used for topics about "history," "chemistry," "politics," etc. Also understand the usage of these words, by association with synonyms. These will enable the students to use richer vocabulary.
