Academic Partnership Development

- 1) Cooperated to establish academic exchange agreement between the School of Medicine and Health Sciences, Monash University Malaysia and the School of Science and Engineering, at the University of Toyama Japan (2019-)
- 2) Cooperated to establish a medical student exchange program at Monash University Malaysia and the University of Toyama Japan (2024-)

Liaison Activities (2025–)

- 1) Medical student exchange program
Facilitated a short-term exchange program involving Year 3 medical students from the University of Toyama, who stayed for three weeks at Monash University Malaysia. During their visit, the students participated in Year 1 and Year 2 medical teaching sessions and interacted with Monash medical students. They were also introduced to the Malaysian healthcare system through educational visits, including a hospital visit to gain insights into local clinical practices (July/Aug 2025).
- 2) STEM Undergraduate Visit -1
Hosted 10 undergraduate students at Monash University Malaysia following their science English learning program at Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM). The students with two academic staff members from the faculty of science) visited Monash to learn about research activities and academic programs, with a focus on scientific communication in English. (March 2025)
- 3) STEM Undergraduate Visit -2
Hosted 15 undergraduate students with one academic staff member from the STEM faculty of the University of Toyama. The visit focused primarily on the School of Pharmacy, where students discussed Monash's science and pharmacology programs and toured research facilities and ongoing research activities. (Oct 2025)
- 4) Gaku Talk Joint Event Facilitation at Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM)
Facilitated participation in the "Gakutalk" joint event held at Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM). Contributed as a session chair, supporting knowledge sharing among 6 undergraduate students from the school of pharmacy and engineering through introductory presentations and academic exchange activities.
